BMHS Students and Parents,

Pennsylvania's Act 158 provides multiple pathways for students to meet graduation requirements. Most of these pathways include showing proficiency in Algebra, Literature, and Biology. One measure of proficiency in these areas is through Keystone Exams. Students take Keystone Exams at the end of courses, but some students may need retesting to reach proficiency. The Keystone Exams are given multiple times each year.

During the 2023-24 school year, the Keystone Exams will be administered in January 2024 and May 2024. Students completing Algebra I, English II, and Biology will take the associated Keystone Exam. Information concerning the Spring Keystone Exams is attached.

Test security is very important during the administration of the Keystone Exams. Students will be informed of the *Code of Conduct for Test Takers*. All students will be asked to certify that they understand these guidelines and their consequences. One additional test security note, students are <u>NOT</u> permitted to have any electronic communication devices (such as cell phones or smart watches) with them in the testing room. Please remind your son/daughter to leave these devices in their locker or at home. All tests must be administered within the regular school setting. Students involved in virtual learning are required to come to the school to take these tests.
